- 1 Balmain/ *Baludarr*: home to students, artists, and professionals
- 2 Barangaroo/ *Muuliya*: named after a Senior Lore Gameraygal Woman
- 3 Blues Point/ *Warrungarea*: named after local mariner Billy Blue
- 4 Dawes Point/ *Tar-Ra*: under the southern pylon of the Harbour Bridge
- 5 *Me-mel*/Goat Island: transferred to Aboriginal ownership in 2023
- 6 Millers Point/ *Coodye*: historic precinct next to The Rocks
- 7 Pyrmont/ *Pirrama*: the Star Casino and the Sydney Fish Market
- 8 Walsh Bay/ *Tar-ra*: the Sydney Theatre Company and restaurants

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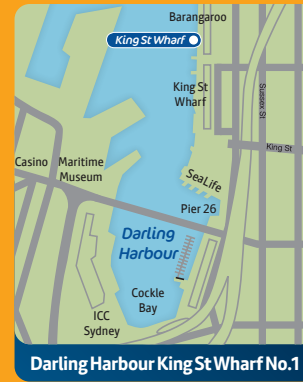

Encompassing all the waters of Sydney Harbour including the Parramatta River, Lane Cove River, Inner Harbour, Main Harbour and Middle Harbour.

MAIN HARBOUR

- Harbour Bridge/*Burrawaa*: one of the world's largest steel arch bridges
- Circular Quay/*Gadii Warranii*: Aboriginal site where saltwater meets freshwater
- Kirribilli/*Giyarabuilli*: the Prime Minister's official Sydney residence
- Opera House/*Dubbagullee*: iconic design taking 16 years to build
- Farm Cove/*Djubaanmagulli*: the historic Royal Botanic Gardens
- Woolloomooloo Bay/*Waalamook*: 5-star hotel and trendy restaurants
- Garden Island/*Bayingawuwa*: the Royal Australian Navy and museum
- Fort Denison/*Mat-te-wan-ye*: rocky island with complete Martello Tower
- Neutral Bay/*Kurrabah*: once all foreign vessels docked here
- Cremorne Pt/*Kurrabah*: foreshore walk and McCallum Pool
- Robertson Point/*Walawaradyung*: lighthouse at Cremorne Pt Reserve
- Elizabeth Bay/*Carraginn*: named after Governor Macquarie's wife
- Rushcutters Bay/*Kogerah*: CYCA home of the Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race
- Clark Island/*Balangalawat*: Aboriginal boat building skills taught here
- Double Bay/*Diendagulla*: elegant boutiques and expensive real estate
- Taronga Zoo/*Tahrongah*: Australia's most famous conservation Zoo
- Bradleys Head/*Burragaii*: the original mast of the HMAS Sydney
- Point Piper/*Woo-la-ra*: home to the rich and famous
- Shark Island/*Boambillia*: National Park Island and a picnic destination
- Rose Bay Girmnaghulla: largest bay in Sydney Harbour

SHARK ISLAND TO MIDDLE HARBOUR

- Nielson Park/*Kuloong*: parklands, beach and rock pools
- Watsons Bay/*Kutti*: famous seafood restaurants and ex-fishing village
- Camp Cove/*Mit-ta-la*: beach at start of South Head nature walk
- South Head/*Tar-ral-be*: military relics and Hornby Lighthouse
- Middle Head/*Kuba Kaba*: Whale Dreaming Ceremonial site
- North Head/*Garungal*: where in 1788 local Aborigines were met
- Quarantine Station/*Garungal*: the most haunted site in Australia
- Middle Harbour/*Warringa*: the lighthouse marks the entrance to Middle Harbour
- Manly/*Kayoo-may*: one of Australia's most famous beaches
