WALKS

Many say that Bruny is best met on foot. There is good reason why. It's dramatic. This drama can be felt on rugged Fluted Cape, atop the steps of Truganini Lookout, and heard in the breeze at East Cloudy Head.

W Listed among Tasmania's 60 Great Short Walks

49 Adventure Bay Beach
Easy walk along beautiful beach.

50 Alonnah Foreshore Walk - 3km/1 Hour
Gentle stroll along a sheltered shore.

51 Bligh Point - 1.5km/2 Hours
Gentle beach stroll plus rock hopping at half tide or lower from signpost at 192 Nebraska Rd, or car park beside Stiffy's Creek.

52 Cape Queen Elizabeth - 13km/4 Hours
Complete walk goes along Mars Beach and out to the Cape. Two routes, depending on tide level. One over Mars Bluff, the other around the Bluff, past the rock arch.

53 Middle Bay - 0.7km
Short boarded walk to surf beach at Middle Bay.

54 Denness Point Heritage Walk - 1km
Short easy walk with great interpretation. Can be extended with foreshore walk.

55 East Cloudy Head - 14km/5 Hours
Long walk along Cloudy Bay Beach up to the headland with fantastic views.

56 Fluted Cape - 5.4km/2.5 Hours
Challenging but rewarding circuit to the top of stupendous cliffs. Access from the Grass Point walk.

57 Grass Point - 4km/1.5 Hours
Gentle stroll to Grass Point with good interpretation.

58 Hansson's Beach
Short beach stroll along beautiful beach.

59 Labillardiere Circuit - 16km/5 Hours
Long circuit around Labillardiere Peninsula. A couple of lovely beaches for lunch along the way.

60 Luggaboinne Circuit - 4.5km/1.5 Hours
Alternative shorter circuit walk on Labillardiere Peninsula.

61 Mabel Bay - 0.6km/30 Minutes
A walking trail from the carpark lookout on Lighthouse Road leading down to beach, 60 metres below.

62 Mavista Falls - 0.8km/30 Minutes
A short nature walk with interpretation near Adventure Bay venturing into ancient rainforest.

63 Mt Mangana - 4km/1.5 Hours
Well formed track with rewarding views at the end.

64 Neck/Blighs Rock - 6km/2 Hours
Beach walk to tessellated pavement at Blighs Rocks at low tide.

65 The Neck and Truganini Lookout - 15 Minutes
A stepped boardwalk takes you to spectacular 360 degree views of Bruny Island.

66 Two Tree Point
Easy walk along beautiful beach.

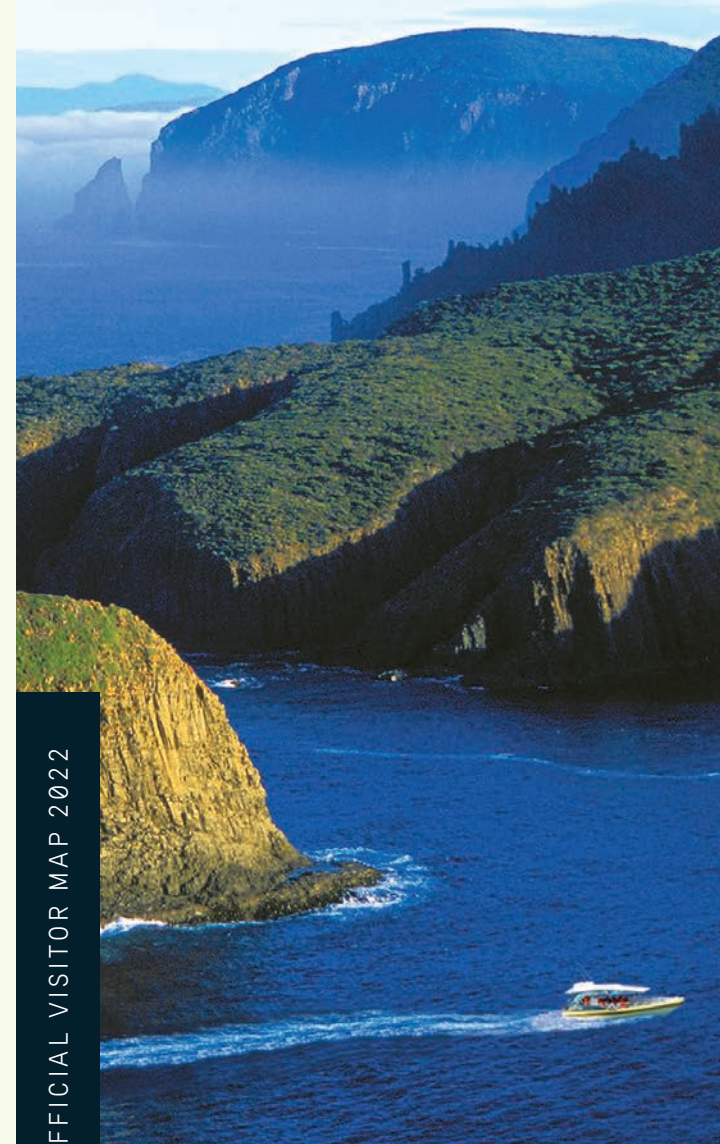
Bruny Island is home to rare and endangered wildlife, please take care on our roads particularly during dusk, dawn and during the evening when wildlife are active.

Get to know Bruny and the island's hidden stories.

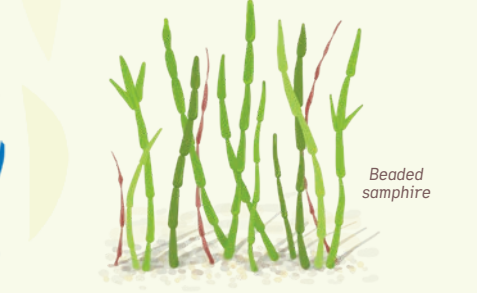

This place is rich.
There's so much to take in so you'll need plenty of time. Island time. Yes, it's really a thing. Just ask the local echidnas. Oh, and keep an eye out for them on our roads, along with their rare mates. Bruny invites you to slow down. Your reward? Those hidden stories. Impromptu chats with a local, discovering a bay of your own or spotting a white wallaby. These are the moments that reveal themselves only to those who take the time. So, stay a little longer. Listen a little closer. And dig a little deeper.



This place is vulnerable.
Often out of sight are the nests of shorebirds like hooded plovers or our little penguins that can deep dive 30 metres with their tiny wings. When we go lightly, Bruny's 12 endemic bird species relax with us; our rainforests cool and coastlines vast. There's a vulnerability to Bruny and its wild locals that is both beautiful and asks us to protect it. We care for Bruny. She cares for us. She lets us reconnect. Reset. Join her rhythms.



This place is remote.
By its very nature, Bruny is wild. It allows us to disconnect. Perhaps even the chance to gift yourself a digital detox. There is a freedom in exploring this remote island, but we must also be aware. After all, the next stop is Antarctica. A sunny bushwalk can morph into a rainy one. Gravel roads require extra care and there are patches where mobile phones are out of range. So be safe out there.



This place is significant.
The presence of Bruny's Traditional Owners runs deep – Aboriginal voices echoing in the winds, the trees, the oceans. Community remains strong today. Across the island you'll discover stories of custodianship, courage, tragedy and survival. You'll experience significant sites. Know how special they are.

Local Tips
Our locals are a friendly bunch. They like the real things: handmade, hand caught and hand crafted. Some have been here generations, others holidayed and stayed. We hope you love the island like the locals do.

- ★ Lunawanna-alonah is a Nuenonne Aboriginal name for Bruny Island.
- ★ The Quarantine Station was used during the 1919 Spanish Flu pandemic.
- ★ Murrayfield is a 4100 hectare working sheep station, owned by wetapoona Aboriginal Corporation.
- ★ Mt Mangana is named after Aboriginal leader Truganini's father.
- ★ The top of Cape Bruny Lighthouse is 11.4 metres above sea level and was first lit in 1838.
- ★ Spot the two trees at Two Tree Point which existed when Captain Cook landed in 1777.
- ★ When viewing little penguins at The Neck, cover torches with red cellophane.
- ★ Make sure you look up! You may see magnificent white bellied sea eagles soaring above.
- ★ Look out for the rare white wallabies living on South Bruny Island.
- ★ Bruny Island is home to the 12 bird species endemic to Tasmania.
- ★ The Fluted Cape is one of the highest sea cliffs in the southern hemisphere.
